The Board of Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Fayetteville, Lincoln County, Tennessee, met in open, public session at the regular meeting place of said Board in the Municipal Building of said City at 5:00 p.m. on September 9, 2014. Mayor John Ed Underwood, Jr. was present and presiding. The following named Aldermen were present:

Approval of Minutes:

Reports:

Fayetteville City Schools:

Alderman Bryant explained that Janine Wilson, the Director of Schools, was attending a conference; therefore could not attend the meeting. Mr. Bryant relayed Dr. Wilson's report. Mr. Bryant stated the Fayetteville City School System has approximately 1,570 registered for the 2014-2015 school year. Mr. Bryant reported that Homecoming will be September 18, 2014, and Fall Blast to be on October 24, 2014.

Fayetteville/Lincoln County Library:

Jill Rael, the Library Director, was not able to attend; therefore, no report was given.

Lincoln Leadership:

Youth Lincoln Leadership students were recognized.

Fire Report:

Fire Chief Danny Travis reported that the Fire Department had 47 calls for service, 35 medical calls and 1 accident with injuries.

Police Report:

Police Chief Richard Howell reported that there were 181 incidents with 74 arrests, 54 crashes and 77 citations for a total of 1,708 events.

Recreation Report:

Ricky Honey, Recreation Director, stated that the last "Music in the Park" event will be September 25, 2014. Mr. Honey explained work has begun on the ball fields in preparation to close them for the winter. Mr. Honey reported that there is a major issue at Don Davison Park pertaining to geese, at this time they will be using "scare tactics" to encourage the birds to relocate.

Public Works:

Eddie Plunkett, Public Works Director, was not present; therefore, no report was given.

Planning and Codes Report:

Jeff Siefert, Building Inspector, reported for the month of May there were three (3) building permits issued for approximately One Hundred Six Thousand, Seven Hundred Dollars (\$106,700.00) in work to be done, with the fees being Six Hundred Fourteen Dollars and 82/100 (\$614.82).

Administrator's Report:

Mr. Collins stated that there will be a construction meeting on September 17, 2014, for the Washington Street paving project, with paving to begin a few days after the meeting. Mr. Collins reported that environmental phase for the LPR Grant has begun. Mr. Collins explained that a work session will be held on September 16, 2014, between the Police/Fire Committee and Finance Committee to discuss police building project.

Resolution No. R-14-05:

Resolution No. R-14-05, a resolution entitled, "Resolution To Support Keep Fayetteville/Lincoln County Beautiful", was considered. Said Resolution is as follows:

RESOLUTION NO. R-14-05

**RESOLUTION TO SUPPORT KEEP FAYETTEVILLE/
LINCOLN COUNTY BEAUTIFUL**

WHEREAS, the City of Fayetteville wishes to maintain the beauty of the City and to promote and encourage environmental responsibility by citizens and organizations having activities in the City; and

WHEREAS, the State of Tennessee has mandated that local governments reduce the amount of solid waste disposed in Class 1 landfills and incinerators by 25 percent; and

WHEREAS, Keep Fayetteville/Lincoln County Beautiful, Inc. (KFLCB) is a Keep America Beautiful Affiliate whose purpose is to provide an educational program to promote a clean and beautiful environment, to educate the citizenry in ways of improving the community's appearance and to promote a model waste management community for Fayetteville and Lincoln County; and

WHEREAS, KFLCB operates the Recycle Center and manages recycling for the City and Lincoln County; and

WHEREAS, the City of Fayetteville and the Lincoln County Commission jointly own the Recycle Center facility; and

WHEREAS, KFLCB promotes America Recycles Day campaigns to promote recycling and "buy recycled" message; and

WHEREAS, KFLCB hosts and coordinates Household Hazardous Waste Collection days to ensure proper disposal of HHW; takes a leading role in environmental programs including Great American Cleanup, Adopt-A-Road, Elk River Cleanup, recycling at ball parks and works jointly with the City on Dump the Junk bulky trash amnesty days; and


WHEREAS, KFLCB is a key partner in Lincoln County's implementation of the State of Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation Solid Waste Management Plan and in identifying preferred waste reduction and recycling practices; and

WHEREAS, KFLCB markets 95 percent of recovered materials for recycling; and

WHEREAS, KFLCB provides education programs for businesses, industry, schools and citizens addressing recycling, waste reduction and collection; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Mayor and Alderman that the City of Fayetteville supports Keep Fayetteville/Lincoln County Beautiful in its efforts in carrying out the many programs of the organization in litter reduction, solid waste reduction and in helping to protect the beauty of our City.

Ordinance No. 2014-12:

Ordinance No. 2014-12, an ordinance entitled, “An Ordinance Of The City Of Fayetteville, Tennessee Amending The Fayetteville Municipal Code Title 17, Chapter 3, Section 17-309 Entitled Residential Solid Waste To Delete There From Paragraph (6)”, was considered. Said Ordinance is as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 2014-12

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF FAYETTEVILLE, TENNESSEE
AMENDING THE FAYETTEVILLE MUNICIPAL CODE TITLE 17,
CHAPTER 3, SECTION 17-309 ENTITLED RESIDENTIAL SOLID
WASTE TO DELETE THEREFROM PARAGRAPH (6).**

WHEREAS, the City of Fayetteville, Tennessee maintains residential sanitation collection for the City; and


WHEREAS, under the existing ordinance, residents are required to place garbage containers for collection no earlier than 7:00 p.m. on the day before collection and remove garbage containers from the curb or street no later than 7:00 p.m. on the day of collection; and

WHEREAS, the time limitations for placement and removal of garbage containers have created a hardship for citizens of the City of Fayetteville.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City of Fayetteville Board of Mayor and Alderman that the Municipal Code shall be amended to repeal in its entirety paragraph (6) of Section 17-309. All other provisions of Section 17-309 shall remain effective.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this amendment shall take effect from and after its, passage, the public welfare requiring it.
